STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-SEVEN

AN ACT providing for the Registration of Guides and to aid in the gathering of Statistics relative to Inland Fish and Game.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. No person shall engage in the business of 2 guiding, (as the term is commonly understood,) before he 3 has caused his name, age and residence to be recorded, in 4 a book kept for that purpose by the commissioners of 5 inland fisheries and game, and procured a certificate from 6 said commissioners, setting forth in substance that he is

- 7 deemed suitable to act as a guide, either for inland fishing 8 or forest hunting, or both, as the case may be. Whoever 9 engages in the business of guiding without having com-10 plied with the provisions of this section forfeits fifty dollars II and costs of prosecution.
- Sect. 2. Each registered guide shall from time to time, 2 as often as requested by the commissioners, on blanks 3 furnished him by the commissioners, forward a statement 4 to them of the number of persons he has guided in inland 5 fishing and forest hunting during the time called for in said 6 statement, the number of days he has been employed as a 7 guide, and such other useful information relative to the 8 inland fish and game, forest fires and the preservation of 9 the forests in the localities where he has guided, as the 10 commissioners may deem of importance to the State.
 - Sect. 3. Such registration, as is herein required, shall 2 take place annually on or before July first; but nothing 3 herein shall be construed to debar the commissioners of 4 inland fisheries and game of the right, in their discretion, 5 to register guides at any time.
- Sect. 4. Whenever any guide registered as aforesaid is 2 convicted of any violation of the inland fish and game laws, 3 he shall forfeit his certificate, and be debarred from further 4 engaging in the business of guiding for one year thereafter. Sect. 5. This act shall not be construed to apply to any
- 2 person, who does not directly or indirectly, hold himself

- 3 out to the public as a guide, or directly or indirectly solicit4 employment as such.
 - Sect. 6. A fee of one dollar shall be paid by each person
- 2 registered in accordance with the provisions of this act, and
- 3 all money thus received shall be and become a part of the
- 4 fund for the protection of inland fish and game.
- Sect. 7. Any person desiring to be registered as a guide
- 2 in accordance with the provisions of this act may make
- 3 application for such registration either in person or by
- 4 written application to the commissioners.
