## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-SEVEN

AN ACT to incorporate Southport and Boothbay Harbor Telephone and Telegraph Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. A. P. Greenleaf, J. S. Maxcy and A. R. Savage,

- 2 their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby created a
- 3 body politic, by the name of the Southport and Boothbay
- 4 Harbor Telephone and Telegraph Company, with all the
- 5 powers, rights and privileges, and subject to all the duties
- 6 and obligations granted and prescribed by the general laws
- 7 of this State relating to corporations. Said corporation shall
- 8 have the right to locate, construct, maintain and operate
- 9 lines of telephone and telegraph between such points as it

10 may determine in the towns of Southport, Boothbay and 11 Boothbay Harbor and the islands therein.

- Sect. 2. Said company shall have the right, within the 2 limits aforesaid, to locate, construct and maintain its lines 3 upon and along any public way, railroad, bridge or private 4 lands, and across tide waters but in such manner as not to 5 incommode or endanger the customary use of such way, 6 road or bridge, with the right to cut down trees, remove 7 obstacles when necessary, within the limits aforesaid, except 8 ornamental, fruit or shade trees, and with the power to estab-9 lish and collect tolls on said line.
- Sect. 3. If the land of any individual or corporation is 2 taken under this act and the parties cannot agree on the 3 damages occasioned thereby, they shall be estimated, secured 4 and paid in the manner provided in case of land taken for 5 railroads.
- Sect. 4. Said corporation is hereby authorized to connect 2 its line or lines with those of any other company, or to sell 3 or lease its line, either before or after completion, to any 4 other telephone or telegraph company, upon such terms as 5 may be mutually agreed upon, which sale or lease shall be 6 binding upon the parties, or to purchase or lease any other 7 line or lines of telegraph or telephone, upon such terms and 8 conditions as may be mutually agreed upon.
- Sect. 5. The amount of the capital stock shall be fixed by 2 vote of the corporation, but not to exceed the amount that 3 may from time to time be considered to be necessary for the

- 4 purposes herein specified, but not exceeding ten thousand
- 5 dollars, and said corporation may purchase, hold, sell
- 6 and convey real estate and personal property necessary for
- 7 the purposes contemplated in this charter.
- Sect. 6. Any one of the corporators named in this act may
- 2 call the first meeting of this company, by mailing a written
- 3 notice to each of the other corporators, seven days at least
- 4 before the day of meeting, naming the time, place and
- 5 purposes of such meeting; and at such meeting a president,
- 6 secretary, treasurer and directors may be chosen, by-laws
- 7 adopted, and any corporate business transacted.
  - Sect. 7. This act shall take effect when approved.
