## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED  
AND NINETY-SEVEN

---

AN ACT to regulate the shooting of ducks on the Kennebec  
river and Merrymeeting bay.

---

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in  
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. Whoever kills, in any manner, any wild duck,  
2 of any kind, on the Kennebec river, or the shores thereof,  
3 south of the Gardiner and Randolph bridge, or on Merry-  
4 meeting bay or the shores thereof, between sunset and the  
5 day light of morning, forfeits twenty-five dollars for each  
6 offense.

Sect. 2. Whoever hunts, kills or destroys any wild duck,  
2 of any kind, within the limits described in section one, with  
3 the aid of jack-lights, so called, or any artificial light, at any  
4 time, forfeits fifty dollars for each offense.
