STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of Maine Industrial School for Girls.

Resolved, That there be and is hereby appropriated from
2 the funds in the State treasury, the sum of seven thousand
3 dollars for the use of the Maine Industrial School for Girls
4 at Hallowell, to meet the current expenses for the year one
5 thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, and ten thousand
6 five hundred dollars to meet the current expenses for the
7 year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight.

Provided the trustees of said school shall have erected a
9 new school building and have said school in operation at
10 the commencement of school year 1898.

Otherwise the sum of seven thousand dollars shall be
12 appropriated for the use of said school for each of the years
13 1897 and 1898.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The overcrowded condition of the two buildings of the Maine Industrial School for Girls at Hallowell, and inability to meet the constant demands of those who are seeking for admission, requires the immediate erection of another building.

The funds for this purpose are already on deposit, having been contributed by friends of the school.

The additional sum asked for for the year 1898, is for the increased expense of maintaining the same during that year, when said school will be in operation.
