STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-SEVEN

AN ACT relating to the taking of Alewives in Bagaduce river
and Walker's pond.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. Section one of chapter two hundred and fifty
2 of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and
3 eighty-seven, as amended by chapter two hundred and fifty-
4 six of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and
5 ninety-five, is hereby further amended by adding at the end
6 of said section the words, 'Provided, however, that it shall
7 be lawful to catch alewives with a gill net on the Bagaduce
8 river between Johnson's narrows and a point five hundred

9 yards from the fishway at Walker's pond,' so that said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Section 1. The taking of alewives, except by hand dip net and weirs between Johnson's narrows and the head of Walker's or Gray's pond, so called, is hereby prohibited, under a penalty of ten dollars for each fish so taken or caught in violation of this act. Provided, however, that it shall be lawful to catch alewives with a gill net on the Bagaduce river between Johnson's narrows and a point five hundred yards from the fishway at Walker's pond.'

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
