IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-SEVEN

AN ACT relating to the taking of Alewives in Bagaduce river and Walker's pond.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section one of chapter two hundred and fifty 2 of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and 3 eighty-seven, as amended by chapter two hundred and fifty-4 six of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and 5 ninety-five, is hereby further amended by adding at the end 6 of said section the words, 'Provided, however, that it shall 7 be lawful to catch alewives with a gill net on the Bagaduce

8 river between Johnson's narrows and a point five hundred

9 yards from the fishway at Walker's pond,' so that said sec-10 tion, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Section 1. The taking of alewives, except by hand dip
12 net and weirs between Johnson's narrows and the head of
13 Walker's or Gray's pond, so called, is hereby prohibited,
14 under a penalty of ten dollars for each fish so taken or caught
15 in violation of this act. Provided, however, that it shall be
16 lawful to catch alewives with a gill net on the Bagaduce
17 river between Johnson's narrows and a point five hundred
18 yards from the fishway at Walker's pond.'

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
