IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-SEVEN

AN ACT to amend section thirty-one of chapter forty of Revised Statutes as amended by chapter two hundred and sixty of Public Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-five and by subsequent acts additional thereto and amendatory thereof.

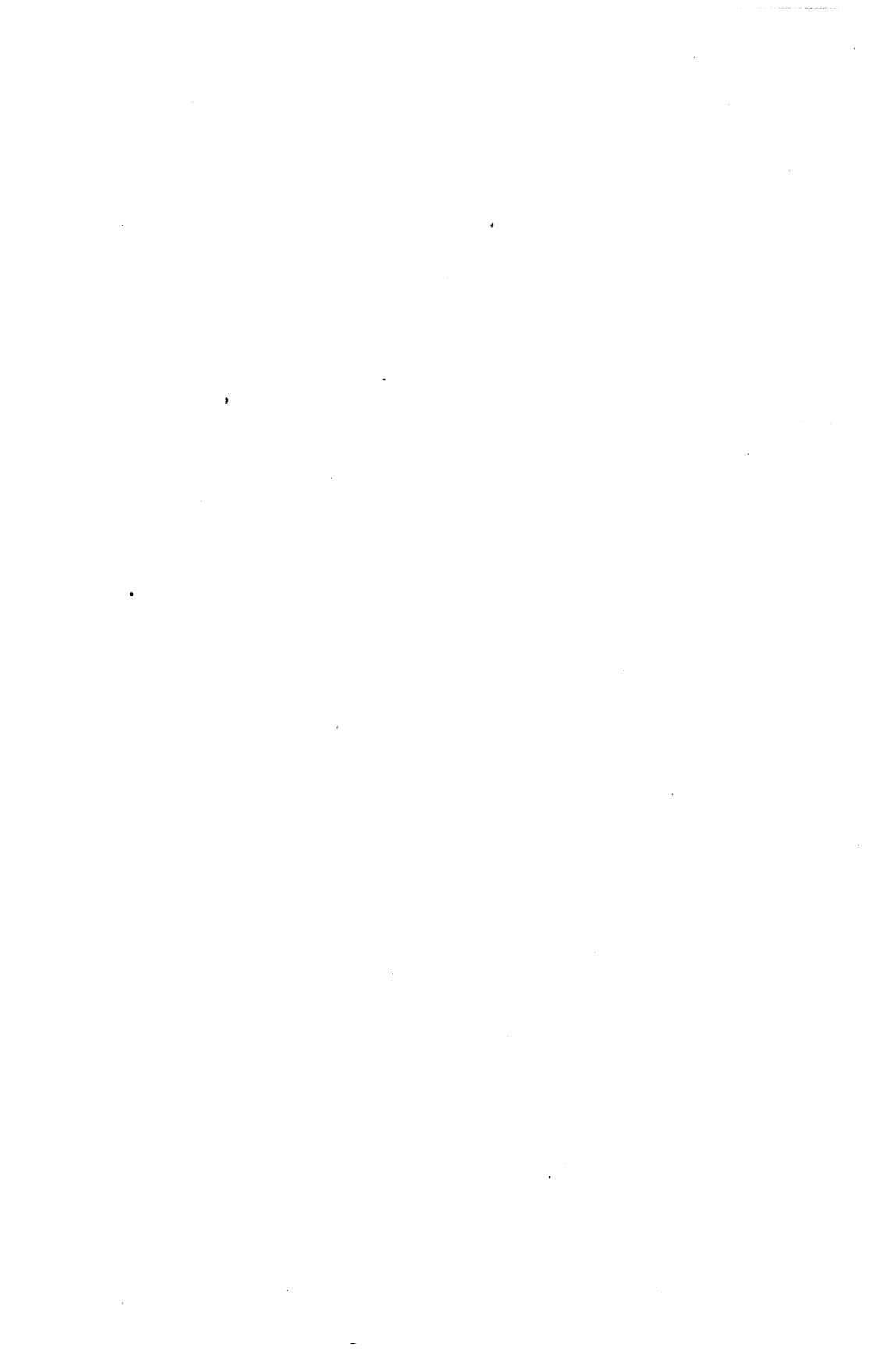
Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section thirty-one of chapter forty of Revised
2 Statutes, as amended by chapter two hundred and sixty of
3 Public Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-five and by all
4 subsequent acts additional thereto and amendatory thereof,
5 is hereby amended by striking out of said section after the
6 word "Sullivan" in the seventh line thereof, the words "Tunk

7 river in Steuben," so that said section as amended shall read
8 as follows:

'Section 31. The following waters and their tributaries
10 are exempt from the provisions relating to migratory fishes
11 and the supervision of the fishways by the commissioners,
12 that is to say, Royal river in North Yarmouth, Sewall's pond
13 or its outlet in Arrowsic, so much of the waters of the Damar-
14 iscotta river as are west of the railroad bridge, near Damar-
15 iscotta Mills, all waters in Vinalhaven, Tremont, Mount
16 Desert, Eden, Franklin and Sullivan, Pleasant river in
17 Washington county, East Machias river and the eastern
18 Penobscot river in Orland.'

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
