STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the Maine Industrial School for Girls.

Resolved, That there be and is hereby appropriated from
2 the funds in the state treasury, the sum of one thousand
3 dollars for the use of the Maine Industrial School for Girls
4 at Hallowell, provided the proposed new school building
5 has been erected and completed.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The managers of the Maine Industrial School for Girls at Hallowell, have voted to erect a building additional to those already in operation, said building to accommodate about thirty pupils, and to be ready for occupancy by January, 1898. They have available funds to the amount of some \$12,000 donated by friends of the School, which sum will be sufficient to erect the building, but not to meet the expense of furnishing the same. The amount asked for in the accompanying resolve is intended to be used for that purpose.
