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## STATE OF MAINE.

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED  
AND NINETY-SEVEN

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AN ACT to amend section forty-five of chapter thirty-eight  
of the Revised Statutes, relating to the Inspection of Milk.

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*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in  
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. Section forty-five of chapter thirty-eight of the  
2 Revised Statutes is hereby amended by inserting after the  
3 word "evidence" in the eighth line of said section the words  
4 'Said inspectors shall leave with the owner of the milk in-  
5 spected a sealed specimen of the milk examined by them  
6 which shall be marked in the same manner as the specimen  
7 taken at that time by said inspectors,' so that said section,  
8 as amended, shall read as follows:

‘Section 45. Inspectors shall keep an office and books for  
10 the purpose of recording the names and places of business  
11 of all persons selling milk within their limits. They may  
12 enter any place where milk is kept or stored for sale, and  
13 examine all carriages used in the conveyance thereof, and  
14 when they have reason to believe any milk found therein  
15 to be adulterated, they shall take specimens thereof, and  
16 cause them to be analyzed or otherwise satisfactorily tested,  
17 and they shall preserve the result as evidence. Said inspec-  
18 tors shall leave with the owner of the milk inspected a  
19 sealed specimen of the milk examined by them which shall  
20 be marked in the same manner as the specimen taken at  
21 that time by said inspectors, and prosecute for all violations  
22 of the two following sections.’
