STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-SEVEN

AN ACT to set off a part of the town of Rome and annex
the same to the town of Belgrade.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. All that part of the town of Rome in the
2 county of Kennebec bounded and described as follows,
3 to wit: Beginning at a point on the eastern shore of Long
4 pond a short distance north of the bridge at Belgrade
5 Mills, at the dividing line between land of Alanson Farn-
6 ham and H. W. Golder, from said point S. 74° E. on said
7 dividing line to the new county road, so called, thence
8 same course over said road to the east line thereof, thence
9 S. 21° W. on said east line to the N. line of a road laid

10 out by the county commissioners about 1842, thence S.
11 78° E. to and over the old county road to land of T. S.
12 Golder, thence south-westerly by said Golder's line to
13 Mill Stream and to old town line; thence by old town line
14 to a point in Long pond, which is S. 31° W. from the
15 point of beginning; thence N. 31° E. to the point of
16 beginning; is hereby set off from said town of Rome and
17 annexed to the town of Belgrade.

Sect. 2. The sum of eight hundred dollars of the valua-
2 tion of the said Rome, from which the state and county
3 taxes are assessed, is hereby deducted therefrom, and the
4 same added to the valuation of the town of Belgrade.

Sect. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
