STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-SEVEN

AN ACT to amend section six of chapter one hundred and eleven of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter seventy-three of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-one, relating to the Recording of Assignments of Wages.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section six of chapter one hundred and eleven of the
2 Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter seventy-three of
3 the Public Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-one, is
4 hereby amended by inserting after the word "wages" in

5 the fourth line, the words 'and if said assignor is commorant
6 in an unorganized place while earning such wages, said
7 assignment shall not be valid against any other person than
8 the parties thereto unless said assignment is recorded by
9 the clerk of the oldest adjoining town, provided there be
10 an incorporated town adjoining such unincorporated place,
11 and if there be no such adjoining town such assignment
12 shall be recorded in the office of the register of deeds for
13 the registry district in which said unincorporated place is
14 located,' so that said section, as amended, shall read as fol-
15 lows:

'Section 6. No assignment of wages is valid against any
17 other person than the parties thereto unless such assign-
18 ment is recorded by the clerk of the city, town or plantation
19 organized for any purpose in which the assignor is com-
20 morant while earning such wages; and if said assignor is
21 commorant in an unorganized place while earning such
22 wages said assignment shall not be valid against any other
23 person than the parties thereto unless said assignment is
24 recorded by the clerk of the oldest adjoining town, pro-
25 vided there be an incorporated town adjoining such unin-
26 corporated place, and if there be no such adjoining town
27 such assignment shall be recorded in the office of the reg-
28 ister of deeds for the registry district in which said unincor-
29 porated place is located, and the clerk's fee shall be twenty-
30 five cents, and no such assignment of wages shall be valid
31 against the employer unless he has actual notice thereof.'
