STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-SEVEN

AN ACT to amend section thirty-eight of chapter sixty-three of
the Revised Statutes, relative to notice in probate pro-
ceedings.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. Section thirty-eight of chapter sixty-three of the
2 Revised Statutes, is hereby amended by inserting after the
3 word "county," in the third line, the words, 'whose court has
4 jurisdiction or in which the deceased last dwelt, as ordered
5 by the judge,' so that said section shall read as follows:

'Section 38. In laws relating to probate courts and pro-
7 ceedings, the words "public notice" denote notice published
8 three weeks successively in a newspaper published in the

9 county whose court has jurisdiction or in which deceased
10 last dwelt, as ordered by the judge, or, if none, in the State
11 paper; the words “personal notice” denote service by a copy
12 given in hand or left at the place of last and usual abode,
13 seven days at least before the time of hearing; and the words
14 “due notice” denote public or personal notice, at the discre-
15 tion of the judge.’

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
