STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-SEVEN

AN ACT to provide for the better Protection of Public Records.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. In cities and towns of more than fifteen hun2 dred inhabitants, the municipal officers shall provide, at the
3 expense of their respective cities and towns, fire proof safes
4 or vaults of ample size for the reception and preservation of
5 all completed books of record and registry belonging to
6 such cities and towns; and upon the completion of each of
7 such books of record and registry, it shall be, by the clerk

8 of such city or town, deposited in such safe or vault and 9 there kept at all times, except when it is required for use.

- Sect. 2. The clerks of all cities and towns shall, in the 2 month of December in each year, make a return to the 3 clerks of the supreme judicial courts in the several counties, 4 showing the number and nature of such books of record 5 and registry as are in their custody, and where they are 6 kept and deposited; said return shall also show where the 7 books of the municipal officers and treasurer are kept and 8 deposited.
- Sect. 3. Any city or town which neglects to perform the 2 duties prescribed by section one of this act shall forfeit for 3 each month so neglecting, the sum of ten dollars, one-half 4 to the complainant and one-half to the county in which such 5 city or town is located.
- Sect. 4. This act shall take effect January first, eighteen 2 hundred and ninety-eight.
