STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-SEVEN

AN ACT to ratify and make valid the doings of the First Baptist Society of New Gloucester, and to authorize the sale of its meeting-house and lot.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. The doings of the First Baptist Society of
2 New Gloucester, in the sale of their parsonage and meeting-
3 house bell are hereby ratified and made valid.

Sect. 2. Said First Baptist Society is hereby authorized
2 to sell and convey its meeting-house and the meeting-house
3 lot to the Maine Baptist Missionary Convention, for such
4 sum as may be agreed upon, said Convention to hold the
5 principal of such purchase price in trust until the same may

6 be required for the use and benefit of a Baptist church and
7 society in New Gloucester, and the said Convention may
8 determine when it is expedient to so use said principal sum,
9 and in the meantime shall have the income thereof.

Sect. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
