## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-SEVEN

AN ACT to amend Chapter one hundred and sixty of the Public Laws of 1895, relating to the State Liquor Commissioner.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section four of chapter one hundred and sixty 2 of the Public Laws of 1895 is hereby amended by striking 3 out all of said section after the word "purchased," in line ten 4 of said section, and inserting in lieu thereof, 'and after the 5 commissioner's accounts shall have been audited and allowed 6 by the governor and council, he shall pay any and all balance 7 of such ten per cent so received by him to the State treas-

8 urer, on or before the first day of January, annually; so 9 that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Section 4. The commissioner is prohibited from borrow11 ing money of any party or parties of whom he may purchase
12 liquors. He shall not sell to municipal officers of this State
13 any intoxicating liquors, except such as have been inspected
14 or tested and found to be pure, in the manner aforesaid,
15 under a penalty of not less than one hundred or more than
16 five hundred dollars, to be recovered by indictment. He
17 shall take of such officers for such pure, unadulterated
18 liquors and for all malt liquors sold to them, ten per cent
19 above the cost thereof at the place where they were by him
20 purchased, and after the commissioner's accounts shall have
21 been audited and allowed by the governor and council,
22 he shall pay any and all balance of such ten per cent so
23 received by him, to the State treasurer, on or before the first
24 day of January, annually.'
