STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-SEVEN

AN ACT to amend section fifty-five of chapter thirty-eight of
the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter 174 of Laws of
1889, in relation to Sale of Pressed Hay.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. Section fifty-five of chapter thirty-eight of the
2 Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter 174 of the Public
3 Laws of 1889, relative to the pressing of hay is hereby
4 amended by adding thereto the following: 'No person who
5 has received hay not marked as provided in this section shall
6 defend any action for the price thereof upon that ground,

7 unless he shall prove that before the delivery of said hay
8 to him, he requested the person from whom he bought the
9 same to comply with the provisions of this section.'
