STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of Simon B. Gates.

Resolved, That the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars
2 be and the same is hereby appropriated to be paid to Simon
3 B. Gates to satisfy his claim against the State for repairs on
4 the Mattawamkeag bridge and pier and approach to same
5 in the town of Mattawamkeag, made by him in 1895, by
6 order of the Governor and Council.

For statement of facts, see report of Governor and Executive Council accompanying the foregoing resolve.

To the President of the Senate and Speaker of the House:

I have the honor to herewith transmit the report of Governor and Executive Council, relative to repairing the State bridge across Mattawamkeag river.

IN COUNCIL, Dec. 29, 1896.

The standing committee on accounts, to which was referred the accompanying account

Report, That the bridge across the Mattawamkeag river in the town of Mattawamkeag is the property of the State and that the State from time to time has appropriated money to keep the same in repair; that in the spring of 1895 one of the stone piers of said bridge was damaged by ice and logs so that it became necessary to immediately repair the same; that the Governor and Council authorized Simon B. Gates of Presque Isle to repair said pier at an expense of one hundred and fifty dollars; that in the summer of 1896 a small bridge which is a part of the approach to the first named bridge and also the property of the State was found to be rotten and unsafe for travel; that the Governor and Council authorized the said Simon B. Gates to rebuild said small bridge at an expense of one hundred dollars; that there was no appropriation for repairing said pier or building said bridge and that the aforesaid sums amounting to two hundred and fifty dollars has not been paid, and are still due from the State to said Gates.
