STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-SEVEN

AN ACT to authorize the County Commissioners of Cumberland county to negotiate a Loan for the payment of Land Damages incurred by the Widening of the Highway known as Forest Avenue, in the city of Deering, in said county.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. The county of Cumberland is hereby author2 ized to negotiate a loan not exceeding forty-eight thou3 sand dollars, exclusive of and in addition to loans author4 ized by chapter two hundred and sixty-five, of the Private
5 and Special Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-three,
6 chapter five hundred and thirty-eight, of the Private and
7 Special Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-three, and

8 chapter thirty-nine of the Private and Special Laws of 9 eighteen hundred and ninety-five, necessary for the payment 10 of land damages incurred by the widening of the highway 11 known as Forest Avenue, in the city of Deering, in said 12 county.

- Sect. 2. Said loan shall become payable at such times as 2 the county commissioners may appoint, and shall bear inter-3 est at the rate of four per cent. per annum, payable semi-4 annually.
- Sect. 3. The county treasurer is hereby authorized under 2 the direction of the county commissioners in order to pro3 cure said loan, to issue ninety-six bonds of the county of 4 Cumberland with interest coupons attached, of the denom5 ination of five hundred dollars each, dated upon a day 6 appointed by the county commissioners, payable to bearer, 7 at such times as the county commissioners may appoint.
- Sect. 4. Said bonds and coupons shall be signed by the 2 county treasurer, and said bonds shall be countersigned by 3 the county commissioners of said county, and shall be sold 4 by the treasurer at the highest price he can obtain; and the 5 proceeds of the same shall be applied for the purposes afore-6 said and for none other.
