STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-SEVEN

AN ACT relating to the Portland Safe Deposit Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section three of chapter seventy of the Pri-2 vate and Special laws of eighteen hundred seventy-five, is 3 hereby amended by striking out the whole of said section 4 and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

Sect. 3. Said corporation shall be entitled to purchase 2 and hold real and personal property to an amount not 3 exceeding the amount of its duly authorized capital stock; 4 may construct, own, maintain and operate safe deposit 5 vaults with boxes and safes therein for rental to its custo-6 mers; may collect and disburse the principal, interest and 7 income of any property which it is authorized to receive

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8 upon deposit; may buy, sell and deal in stocks and bonds o and carry on a general brokerage business; may invest and 10 loan moneys and receive the same upon deposit; may act 11 as agents for the purpose of registering and countersigning 12 certificates of stock, bonds, or other evidences of indebted-13 ness issued by any corporation or municipality; may act as 14 trustee of any real or personal property on trusts duly cre-15 ated, and may execute fully any such trusts; may act as 16 executor, trustee, or assignee, under legal appointment, 17 with the same powers and subject to the same liabilities and 18 obligations as individuals acting in like capacities, except 19 that in the discretion of the court by which such appoint-20 ment shall be made, no sureties may be required upon its 21 official bond given in such cases and that all papers relat-22 ing thereto shall be signed and sworn to by such one or 23 more of its officers as the corporation shall designate to act 24 in its behalf.

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
