STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-SEVEN

AN ACT to amend section 2 of chapter 58 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter 94 of Public Laws of 1891, relating to election of members of Board of Agriculture.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section 2 of chapter 58 of the Revised Statutes, 2 as amended by chapter 94 of Public Laws of 1891 is hereby 3 amended by adding the words 'at least two weeks prior to 4 said meeting' after the word "others" in the sixth line of 5 said section, so that said section as amended shall read as 6 follows:

'If there is more than one such society in a county the 8 executive officers of the oldest shall designate a time and 9 place for a convention of five delegates, chosen from each 10 society at a regular meeting; and the secretary of such old-II est society shall give written notice thereof to the secretary 12 of each of the others, at least two weeks prior to said meet-The convention shall be held prior to the third 13 ing. 14 Wednesday of January, and shall elect a president and 15 secretary and by ballot, a member of the board of agricul-16 ture for that county. If no election is made, the secretary 17 shall immediately send to the governor and council the 18 names of two or more persons having the highest number 19 of votes; and they shall elect one of them. Vacancies in 20 counties, however caused, shall be filled within three months 21 after notice to the secretary of the oldest society in the 22 county where such vacancy exists; if there is more than one 23 at a special meeting, in the same manner as is hereinbefore 24 provided for the election of county members of said board. 25 The written certificate of the secretary of the society or con-26 vention electing a member, shall be his credentials in the 27 board.'
