## STATE OF MAINE.

#### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-SEVEN

AN ACT in relation to the School Committee of the City of Portland.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. In addition to the members of the school com-2 mittee of the city of Portland, as provided in the charter of 3 said city, there shall be elected annually by a general vote 4 of the city, at the time the other city officers are elected, 5 three female members of said committee to hold office for 6 the term of one year with the same powers as other mem-7 bers of the committee.

Sect. 2. No amendment of said charter or substitute 2 therefor shall affect this act unless so specifically provided 3 in said amendment or substitute.

This act, except this section, shall not take effect Sect. 3. 2 until accepted by the voters of said city in ward meetings 3 duly called by the mayor and aldermen, warned and con-4 ducted in the manner provided by law, and to be held on 5 the date fixed by them, those favoring the adoption thereof 6 voting yes, and those opposed voting no; and thereupon 7 the same proceedings shall be had respecting the sorting, 8 counting, declaring, and recording the returns of said votes 9 as is herein provided at the election of mayor; and the 10 board of mayor and aldermen shall within three days meet 11 together and compare the returns of the ward officers; and 12 if it appear that a majority of all the votes given on the ques-13 tion of its acceptance are in favor thereof, the mayor shall 14 forthwith make proclamation of the fact, and thereupon this 15 act shall take effect.
