STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-SEVEN

AN ACT to amend section 27, chapter 91 of the Revised Statutes relating to liens.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section 27, chapter 91 of the Revised Statutes 2 is hereby amended by inserting after the words "arrives at 3 the port of shipment," in the third line from the bottom of 4 said section, the words "and until it has been shipped on 5 board a vessel or laden in a car," so that said section as 6 amended shall read as follows:

'Section 27. Whoever digs, hauls, or furnishes rock for 8 the manufacture of lime, has a lien thereon for his personal 9 service, and on the rock so furnished, for thirty days after 10 such rock is manufactured into lime, or until such lime is

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11 sold or shipped on board a vessel; whoever labors in quarry-22 ing or cutting and dressing granite in any quarry, has a lien 13 for his wages on all the granite quarried or cut and dressed 14 in the quarry by him or his co-laborers for thirty days after 15 such granite is cut and dressed, or until such granite is sold 16 or shipped on board a vessel; and whoever labors in mining, 17 quarrying or manufacturing slate in any quarry, has a lien 18 for the wages of his labor on all slate mined, quarried or 19 manufacturing in the quarry by him or his co-laborers for 20 thirty days after the slate arrives at the port of shipment, 21 and until it has been shipped on board a vessel or laden in 22 a car; such liens have precedence of all other claims, and 23 may be enforced by attachment within the times aforesaid.'
