## STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE to provide for the Extinguishment of the Claim of Don H. Powers and Dr. A. G. Sirois against the State for services rendered in connection with the shooting of Game Warden E. O. Collins by Charles Morris.

---

*Resolved,* That the sum of two hundred dollars be and  
2 hereby is appropriated to extinguish the claim of Don H.  
3 Powers against the state for services rendered in the  
4 prosecution of Charles Morris at Houlton S. J. Court, and  
5 the sum of sixty-six dollars to extinguish the claim of Dr.  
6 A. G. Sirois of Fort Kent, for attending E. O. Collins  
7 when he was shot by Charles Morris.



### STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Dr. A. G. Sirois was employed by Messrs. Wentworth and Oak to attend warden E. O. Collins after he had been shot by guide Charles Morris. The doctor undoubtedly saved his life. He cannot pay him.

Dr. Sirois has presented a bill for four hundred and fifty-four dollars. Hon. Don H. Powers was employed to aid in the prosecution of Morris, who was convicted and sentenced to a term of ten years in State Prison. Mr. Powers has rendered a bill for two hundred dollars, which in our opinion is a reasonable one.
