STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-SEVEN

AN ACT in relation to the Duties and Compensation of the
State Prison Physician.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. It shall be the duty of the state prison
2 physician to visit the state prison daily to attend to sick
3 prisoners; also to examine all prisoners claiming to be ill
4 and determine their ability to work. For these services
5 and for attendance upon the insane department of the
6 state prison, under the direction of the superintendent of
7 the Maine Insane Asylum, he shall be paid two hundred
8 and fifty dollars out of the state treasury, in addition to
9 the compensation now provided by law.

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
