STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the Town of Waldoboro'.

Resolved, That there be paid to the town of Waldoboro'
2 out of the school fund for eighteen hundred and ninety-nine,
3 the sum of four hundred and forty-four dollars and sixty-
4 three cents, on account of an error made in returning the
5 number of scholars from that town for the year eighteen
6 hundred and ninety-eight.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

*To the Honorable Senators and Representatives of the State of
Maine, in Legislature assembled:*

In my school return to the State superintendent of schools for the year 1898, the total number of scholars entitled to draw school money for that year was, by reason of a clerical error, stated as five hundred and sixty-seven; whereas, the correct number of scholars for said year, obtained by an actual canvass, as shown by the records of this office, is seven hundred and forty-eight; making 181 scholars for which the town of Waldoboro' has not been allowed in the apportionment of the school fund for the year 1898, leaving a deficiency amounting to \$444.63, as computed by the State treasurer, as per his letter to me, dated December 8, 1898.

The census of scholars for the year 1898 was carefully compiled, and an affidavit in relation thereto has been forwarded to the State treasurer.
