STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT
HUNDRED AND NINETY-NINE.

AN ACT to amend chapter four hundred and ninety-one of the
Private Laws of the year 1893.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. Chapter 491 of the Private Laws of the year 1893
2 is hereby amended by adding to section one of said chapter
3 491, the following words, to wit: 'and said company shall, at
4 its own expense, when sorting logs, station a man at each sort-
5 ing gap, who shall count and scale any and all stray logs taken
6 into the boom of said company, and not belonging to said
7 company, and shall render an account of same, under oath, to
8 the clerk of the Penobscot Lumbering Association, at Bangor,

9 Maine, yearly, at the end of the time of sorting. Said man so
10 stationed as aforesaid shall be appointed by the president of
11 said lumbering association, and shall serve at an expense of
12 not exceeding two dollars per day. Such stray logs, not
13 belonging to said company, if spruce logs or other logs used by
14 said company for pulp, shall either be turned out into a drive
15 in Piscataquis river, or kept by said company, to be paid for
16 to the owner, at one dollar less per thousand feet than the same
17 mark sells for on the shore below Penobscot boom, the usual
18 place of sale.'
