## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-NINE.

AN ACT to prevent the wearing of Spiked Boots or Shoes in Public Places.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. No person wearing boots or shoes with spikes or 2 calks in the sole or heel thereof shall enter any public building, 3 hotel, depot, railway car, or steamboat, without special permis-4 sion from the owner, lessee, person in charge thereof, or some 5 officer, agent or servant of either of them, or having entered 6 shall remain therein after having been requested to leave such 7 public building, hotel, depot, railway car or steamboat, by the

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8 owner, lessee, person in charge thereof or some officer, agent9 or servant of either of them.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates either of the provisions of section 2 one of this act shall on complaint and conviction be fined not 3 less than one dollar nor more than ten dollars, but a person 4 having entered as aforesaid without permission and remaining 5 after having been requested to leave as above provided shall 6 only be convicted of violating one of the provisions of section 7 one of this act.

Sect. 3. No person shall be convicted of any offense under 2 this act unless a printed copy of the same shall have been 3 posted in a conspicuous place in the public building, hotel, 4 depot, railway car or steamboat where said offense is committed 5 for at least thirty days prior to the commission of said offense, 6 and is also posted at the time of said offense.

Sect. 4. Whoever wilfully destroys, defaces or tears down 2 any printed copy of this act posted under section three hereof 3 shall forfeit not less than one nor more than ten dollars to be 4 recovered on complaint.
