STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT
HUNDRED AND NINETY-NINE.

AN ACT to amend section 6 of chapter 156 of the Public Laws
of 1895, entitled "An Act to amend section 6 of chapter 35 of
the Revised Statutes, relating to Intelligence Offices."

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 6 of chapter 156 of the Public Laws of 1895 is hereby
2 amended by inserting after the word "money" in the tenth line
3 thereof the following words, viz: 'in excess of one dollar,' so
4 that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Section 6. The municipal officers of any town may, on pay-
6 ment of one dollar each, grant licenses to suitable persons for
7 one year, unless sooner revoked after notice and for cause, to
8 keep offices for the purpose of obtaining employment for

9 domestics, servants or other laborers, except seamen, or of
10 giving information relating thereto, or of doing the usual
11 business of intelligence offices; whoever keeps such an office,
12 without a license, forfeits not exceeding fifty dollars for every
13 day that it is so kept. The keeper of an intelligence office
14 shall not retain any sum of money, in excess of one dollar,
15 received from a person seeking employment through the agency
16 of such intelligence office, unless employment of the kind sought
17 for is actually furnished. The keeper of a licensed intelligence
18 office shall cause two copies of this act, printed in type of
19 sufficient size to be legible and easily read, to be conspicuously
20 posted in each room used or occupied for the purposes of such
21 intelligence office. Whoever violates the provisions of this act
22 shall have the license revoked, and shall be punished by fine
23 not exceeding twenty dollars for each offence.'
