STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-NINE.

AN ACT to amend chapter three hundred and thirty-four of the Public Acts of 1897, regulating the sale and analysis of Concentrated Commercial Feeding Stuffs.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 2 of chapter 334 of the Public Acts of 1897 is hereby 2 amended by striking out the words: "Neither shall it include 3 wheat, rye and buckwheat brans or middlings, not mixed with 4 other substances, but sold separately, as distinct articles of 5 commerce, nor pure grains ground together," so that when 6 amended said section shall read as follows:

'Sect. 2. The term concentrated commercial feeding stuff, as 8 here used, shall not include hays and straws, the whole seeds 9 nor the unmixed meals made directly from the entire grains of

10 wheat, rye, barley, oats, Indian corn, buckwheat, and broom 11 corn.'

Section 8 of said chapter 334 is hereby amended by striking 13 out the words: "but it shall be the duty of said Secretary, upon 14 thus ascertaining any violation of this act, to forthwith notify 15 the manufacturer, importer or dealer in writing, and give him 16 not less than thirty days thereafter in which to comply with the 17 requirements of this act, but there shall be no prosecution in 18 relation to the quality of any concentrated commercial feeding 19 stuff if the same shall be found substantially equivalent to the 20 certified statement named in section four of this act," so that 21 when amended said section shall read as follows :

'Sect. 8. Whenever the director becomes cognizant of the 23 violation of any of the provisions of this act, he shall report 24 such violation to the secretary of the board of agriculture, and 25 said secretary shall prosecute the party or parties thus reported.'
