STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of repairing a road leading from Van Buren to
Caribou, Aroostook County, at a point in Cyr Plantation leading
to Connor Plantation.

Resolved, That the sum of two hundred dollars be and hereby
2 is appropriated out of any money in the treasury of the state
3 for repairing and maintaining the road in Cyr plantation known
4 as the Caribou road and leading from Cyr plantation into
5 Connor plantation, Aroostook county, the same to be expended
6 under the direction of the county commissioners of Aroostook
7 county, in the year eighteen hundred and ninety-nine.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

This road over which the United States mail is transported, running through low and swampy land, is during the spring and fall nearly impassable, the appropriations of the plantations through which the road passes are insufficient for its maintenance.
