### RESOLVE in favor of Harriet Upton.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the State treasury, to

- 3 sion of four dollars per month, beginning January first, eight-
- 4 een hundred and ninety-nine.



#### STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Harriet Upton is an aged lady upwards of eighty years, very feeble and infirm and very deaf, and destitute of means wherewith to obtain a livelihood. She is the widow of the late Henry Upton who was a soldier in the Aroostook war, and who was pensioned for injuries received in the service of the State during said war. Said original resolve granting said pension being approved February 22, 1858, and which pension was continued to the said Henry Upton till 1863, when it was reduced to four dollars per month, which was paid to him till 1892, the time of his death, since which time his widow has had no income, and at the present time is obliged to rely upon the charity of relatives and friends, none of whom are able to bear the burden.
