STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of blasting a ledge in the town of Frenchville
in the County of Aroostook.

Resolved, That the sum of four hundred dollars be and is
2 hereby appropriated to blast a ledge on the highway road between
3 Van Buren and Fort Kent, said ledge being in the northwest
4 part of the town of Frenchville; said sum to be expended is to
5 be in the hands of the county commissioners of said Aroostook
6 county.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The road at this place is so narrow (twelve feet in some places) that it makes it very dangerous. It has been blasted before but there remains a cliff twenty feet high in some places and extending for the distance of seventy to eighty feet along the road. The object of this appropriation is to widen the road and make it safer, for at that place the river flows about seventy feet below at high water mark.
