STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the Town of Madawaska.

Resolved, That the sum of \$200, two hundred dollars, is 2 hereby appropriated to build a bridge in the town of Mada-3 waska on the Martin brook, so called, providing the said 4 town appropriates an equal amount for same, and the entire 5 sum be expended under the direction of the county commis-6 sioners of Aroostook county.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

This bridge is situated on the much travelled road between Van Buren and Fort Kent, in the town of Madawaska. It is about seventy feet in length and across a deep gully or brook of over one hundred and twenty feet in height. The object of this appropriation is to build a longer and more substantial bridge as the old one is now unsafe.
