STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT
HUNDRED AND NINETY-NINE.

AN ACT to Set off certain Territory from Pittsfield Village
Corporation.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. The following territory, together with all the
2 inhabitants thereon, is hereby set off from Pittsfield Village
3 Corporation: Beginning at a point on the Sebasticook river
4 in the town of Pittsfield at the southwest corner of land
5 of J. W. Burse, thence running easterly on the south line of
6 said Burse's land to the range line between Range No. 14,
7 and Range No. 15; thence southerly on said range line to the
8 southwest corner owned by the late Edgar J. Garcelon;
9 thence easterly on the south line of said Garcelon land to the

10 east line of the town of Pittsfield; thence northerly on the
11 east line of said town to the northeast corner of said town;
12 thence westerly on the north line of said town to the Sebas-
13 ticook river; thence southerly on said Sebasticook river to
14 the place of beginning. Also the land owned and occupied
15 by Harrison W. Gardiner, John H. Coffin, the farm known as
16 the Noah Marsh farm and the land owned and occupied by
17 Orin Libby, all situated in the town of Pittsfield on the east
18 side of the Sebasticook river. Also the land owned and oc-
19 cupied by W. P. Martin and Perry Furbush, both parcels
20 situated in the town of Pittsfield, on the west side of the
21 Sebasticook river.

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
