
STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT
HUNDRED AND NINETY-NINE.

AN ACT relating to the Indian Reservation in the town of Perry,
Washington County.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

The governor and council may at the expense of the state
2 and for the benefit of the Passamaquoddy Indians, lease or sell
3 the whole or any part of the Indian Reservation in the town of
4 Perry, Washington county, on such terms as they deem just,
5 and all sums received from such leases or sales shall be credited
6 to the funds of said Indians.



HOUSE AMENDMENT "A."

Amend by adding the following after the word "just" in the (5th) fifth line 'and may authorize the chairman of the Council Committee on Indian Affairs to execute in behalf of the state, all deeds and leases necessary to carry out the provisions of this act.'

Adopted.

AMENDMENT "B."

Strike out all after the word "be" in the (6th) sixth line of said act and add the following, 'paid to the agent of said tribe of Indians for the use of said tribe.'

Adopted.
