### STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-NINE.

AN ACT to amend section two of chapter sixty of the Revised Statutes as amended by Chapter one hundred and seventy-nine of the Public Laws of 1893, relating to Divorce.


Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section two of chapter sixty of the Revised

- 2 Statutes, as amended by chapter one hundred and seventy-nine
- 3 of the Public Laws of 1893, is hereby further amended by
- 4 inserting after the word "intoxication," in the sixth line of said
- 5 section, as amended, the words, 'from the use of intoxicating
- 6 liquors, opium, or other drugs,' so that said section, as amended,
- 7 shall read as follows:

'Sect. 2. A divorce from the bonds of matrimony may be 9 decreed by the supreme judicial court in the county where 10 either party resides, at the commencement of proceedings for 11 causes of adultery, impotence, extreme cruelty, utter desertion 12 continued three consecutive years next prior to the filing of the 13 libel, gross and confirmed habits of intoxication from the use of 14 intoxicating liquors, opium, or other drugs, cruel and abusive 15 treatment, or on the libel of the wife, where the husband being of 16 sufficient ability or being able to labor and provide for her, grossly 17 or wantonly and cruelly refuses or neglects to provide suitable 18 maintenance for her, provided that the parties were married in 19 this state or cohabited here after marriage, or if the libelant 20 resides here when the cause of divorce accrued, or had resided 21 here in good faith for one year prior to the commencement of 22 proceedings. But when both parties have been guilty of adul-23 tery, or there is collusion between them to procure a divorce, it 24 shall not be granted. Either party may be a witness.'

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
