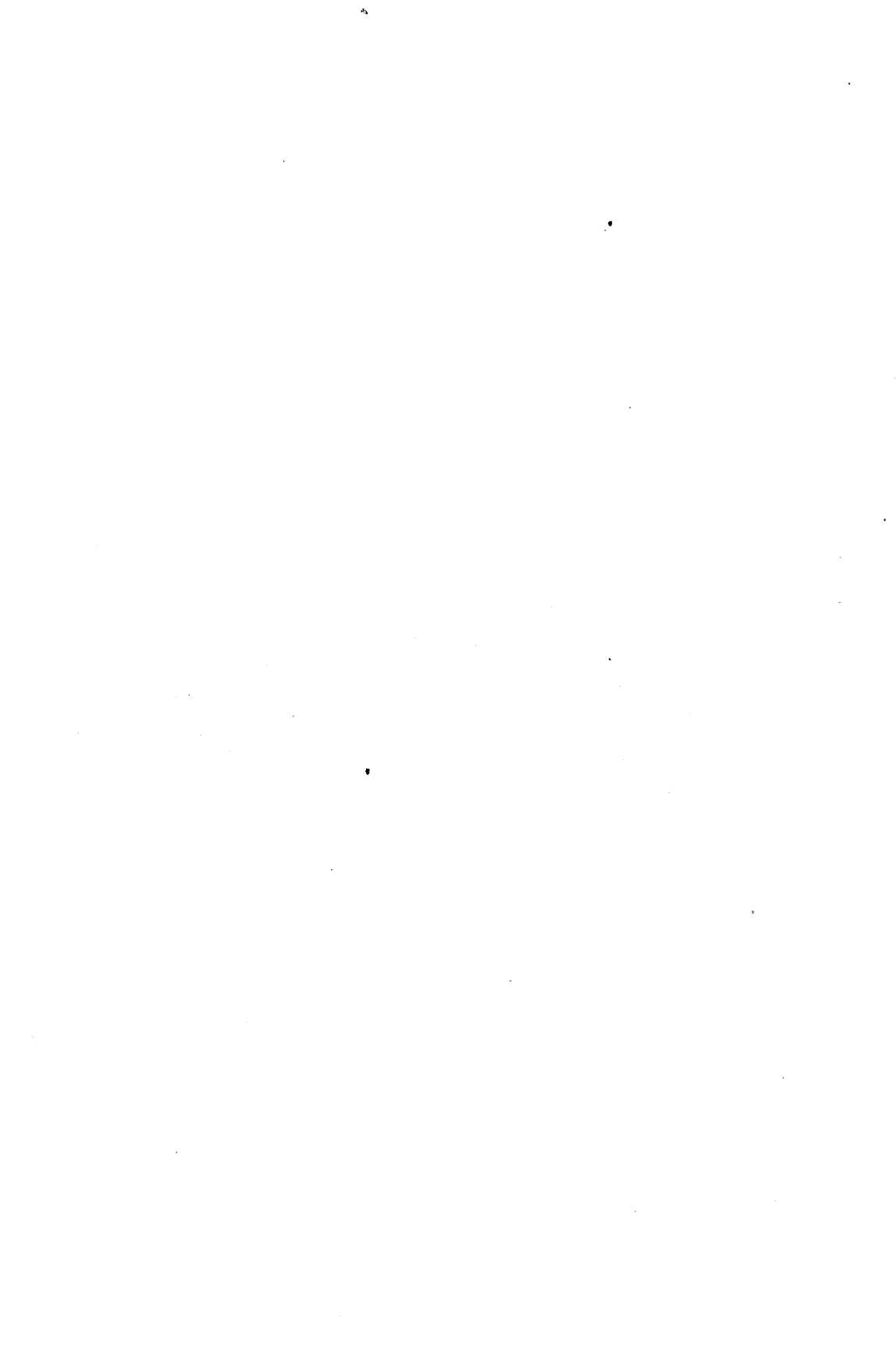
IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT
HUNDRED AND NINETY-NINE.

AN ACT giving a Lien for Shoring and Running Logs.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. Whoever both shores and runs logs by himself,
2 his servants or agents, has a lien thereon for the price of such
3 shoring and running, which shall continue for sixty days after
4 the logs arrive at the place of destination for manufacture, and
5 such lien may be enforced by attachment.

Sect. 2. The provision of sections forty-two, forty-three,
2 forty-four and forty-five of chapter ninety-one of the Revised
3 Statutes shall apply to the lien given by this act.
