STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of Charles M. Bradbury of Biddeford in the county of York.

Be it resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives in 2 Legislature assembled, as follows:

Whereas said Charles M. Bradbury enlisted and was mustered 4 into Co. G., 1st Maine Regiment, as a private in the late 5 Spanish-American war, and there was issued to him one pair of 6 pants and blouse: and, whereas, at the time he was mustered 7 out of the service he was charged for one overcoat, one hat 8 and one pair of leggings which were never issued to him: 9 and, whereas, there was held back from the amount of his pay 10 as such private the price of said overcoat, hat and leggings 11 amounting to twelve dollars:

Be it resolved that said Charles M. Bradbury be paid said sum 13 of twelve dollars out of the treasury of the State of Maine to 14 reimburse him for that sum unjustly withheld from him in 15 manner aforesaid.
