STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-NINE.

AN ACT to amend Section one of Chapter two hundred and ninetyeight of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-nine, as amended by the Public Laws of eighteen hundred and ninetynine, relating to Hawkers and Peddlers.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section one of chapter two hundred and ninety-

- 2 eight of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-nine,
- 3 as amended by the Public Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-
- 4 nine, is hereby amended by inserting after the word "brooms"
- 5 the words 'pianos, organs, riding vehicles, harnesses, millinery,
- 6 clothing,' so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

Section 2.

'Sect. 1. No person shall go about from town to town or 8 from place to place in the same town exposing for sale or selling any goods or chattels other than fruit grown in the United 10 States, fruit trees, provisions, live animals, brooms, pianos, 11 organs, riding vehicles, harnesses, millinery, clothing, agricultural implements, fuel, newspapers, agricultural products of the 13 United States, the products of his own labor or the labor of his 14 family, any patent of his own invention or in which he has 15 become interested by being a member of any firm, or stock-16 holder in any corporation which has purchased the patent, until 17 he shall have procured a license so to do as hereinafter provided.'

This act shall take effect when approved.
