### STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-NINE.

AN ACT for the Protection of the Fish in the Tributaries of Moosehead Lake.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section I. No person shall take, catch, kill, fish for or

- 2 destroy any trout, land-locked salmon or other fish in any of
- 3 the following named streams, tributaries of Moosehead lake,
- 4 Bog brook, Squaw brook, Lucky brook, Norcross brook,
- 5 Baker brook, Moose brook, Carry brook, North and South
- 6 brook, Beaver creek, Tom Hegan stream, Williams stream,
- 7 Spencer stream, Mud Pond stream, Socatten stream, and
- 8 Roach river, nor at the mouth of any such stream, emptying

9 into Moosehead lake. It shall be the duties of the commis-10 sioners of inland fisheries and game to establish what shall 11 be regarded as the mouth of the stream under this act; and 12 when the mouth of the stream has been established the points 13 so fixed shall be plainly marked upon the shores of the lake 14 and a printed notice posted thereon stating the stream and 15 mouth of the stream has been closed to fishing, with the 16 penalties for the violation of the same plainly printed thereon.

Sect. 2. Any person who shall violate the provisions of 2 this act shall forfeit and pay the sum of twenty dollars for 3 the attempt and one dollar for each and évery trout, and land-4 locked salmon or other fish so taken, caught, killed or 5 destroyed to be recovered by complaint.

Sect. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
