STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-NINE.

AN ACT to regulate the taking of Herring in the Town of Cutler.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

The use of purse or drag seines or set nets in fishing for 2 herring in the waters of the town of Cutler, northerly of a 3 line commencing at the southern extremity of the southern 4 island called the Double Head Shots and running easterly 5 to Little River Head, thence easterly to the eastern line of 6 said Cutler, is hereby prohibited under a penalty of not less 7 than five dollars nor more than twenty-five dollars, and the 8 forfeiture of all nets; provided, that it shall be lawful for

9 one boat only from each vessel so employed and for fisher-

10 men who use small boats only to use a net or nets, the total 11 or combined length of which shall not be more than seventy-12 five yards nor more than five yards in width, but not more 13 than one such described net or nets shall be used at any one 14 time. •
