STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT
HUNDRED AND NINETY-NINE.

AN ACT providing for the appointment and compensation of
Recorder of the Municipal Court of the city of Saco.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. The governor, by and with the advice and consent
2 of the council, shall appoint the recorder of the municipal court
3 of the city of Saco, who shall be an attorney at law, a resident
4 of said Saco, duly qualified, who shall be sworn by the judge
5 of said court, who shall keep the records of said court when
6 requested so to do by the judge; and in case of absence from
7 the court room or sickness of the judge, or when the office of
8 judge shall be vacant, the recorder shall have and exercise all
9 the powers of the judge, and perform all the duties required of
10 said judge, as fully and with the same effect as the judge could

11 do were he acting in the premises; and the signature of the
12 recorder, as such, shall be sufficient evidence of his right to act
13 instead of the judge; said recorder shall hold his office until
14 another is qualified in his place.

Sect. 2. When the office of judge shall be vacant the recorder
2 shall receive the compensation of the judge, but for all services
3 rendered except when there is a vacancy in the office of judge,
4 the recorder shall be paid by the judge.

Sect. 3. All acts or parts of acts inconsistent herewith are
2 hereby repealed.

Sect. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.
