IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-NINE.

AN ACT to amend Chapter 295 of the Public Laws of 1897, relating to Discontinuing Schools and Conveying School Children.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Chapter 295 of the Public Laws of 1897 is hereby amended

- 2 by striking out the word "sixteenth" in the fifth line of section
- 3 one of said chapter and inserting in place thereof the word
- 4 'fifteenth,' so that said section 1 of chapter 295, as amended,
- 5 shall read as follows:

'Section 3 of chapter 11 of the Revised Statutes, as amended

- 7 by section 2 and 3 of chapter 216 of the Public Laws of 1893,
- 8 is hereby amended by striking out all of said section after the
- 9 word "town" in the fifteenth line thereof, and adding 'but
- 10 any public sohool failing to maintain an average attendance for

11 any school year of at least eight pupils shall be and hereby is

12 suspended, unless the town in which said school is located shall

13 by vote instruct its superintending school committee to main-

14 tain said school. The superintendent of schools in each town

15 shall procure the conveyance of all public school pupils residing

16 in his town, to and from the nearest school, for the number of

17 weeks for which schools are maintained in each year, when such

18 pupil resides at such a distance from the said school as to ren-

19 der such conveyance necessary.'
