STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-NINE.

AN ACT to amend Chapter two hundred seventy-nine of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred ninety-seven, relating to the Packing of Sardines.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Chapter two hundred seventy-nine of the Pub-2 lic Laws of eighteen hundred ninety-seven is hereby amended 3 so as to read as follows:

'Section I. The commissioner of sea and shore fisheries 5 shall require a strict observation of the following rules. 6 Whoever catches, takes, preserves, sells, or offers for sale, 7 between the first day of December and the tenth day of the 8 following May, any herring for canning purposes, less than

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9 eight inches long, measured from one extreme to the other, 10 or packs or cans sardines of any description, between the 11 first day of December and the tenth day of the following 12 May, forfeits twenty dollars for every hundred cans so 13 packed or canned, and for every hundred herring so taken; 14 and whoever bakes, fries, packs or cans any herring or other 15 fish for sardines without first heading the same, and whoever 16 sells, offers for sale or has in his possession for sale any 17 sardines packed without being so headed shall forfeit twenty 18 dollars for every hundred cans so packed, sold, offered for 19 sale or in possession for sale, to be recovered by indictment 20 or action of debt, one-half to the complainant or prosecutor, 21 and one-half to the town in which the offense is committed.'

'Sect. 2. All cans shall be decorated, stamped or labelled, 23 with quality, packer's name and place of business, or mer-24 chant's name for whom the same are packed. Whoever 25 ships, sells or offers for sale, any sardines in violation of this 26 section shall forfeit twenty dollars for every one hundred 27 cans so shipped, sold or offered for sale, to be recovered by 28 action, indictment or action of debt, one-half to the complain-29 ant or prosecutor and one-half to the town in which the 30 offense was committed.'

'Sect. 3. The commissioner of sea and shore fisheries shall 32 insist upon the strict enforcement of this act and require from 33 the wardens who have jurisdiction in localities where sar-34 dine canning factories are located, to give a good and suffi-35 cient bond in the sum of five thousand dollars payable to the 36 treasurer of the State of Maine, said bond to be deposited in 37 the State treasury, to guarantee the faithful and strict en-

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38 forcement of the provisions of this act and its penalties, and 39 in no case shall a packer of sardines be accepted as a surety.'

'Sect. 4. The commissioner of sea and shore fisheries or his 41 wardens shall inquire into violations of the laws relating to 42 sardines and enforce the penalties thereto, and for the pur-43 pose of inquiring into any violation of said laws, and enforc-44 ing the penalties thereof, such commissioner or his deputies 45 may at all reasonable times enter any manufactory, or can-46 ning establishment, and make investigations concerning the 47 methods employed and the condition of the product, and if 48 necessary, open packages and cut open cans of sardines for 49 such investigation. Sufficient wardens shall be appointed by 50 the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries to enforce the 51 provisions of this act, and for the city of Eastport and town 52 of Lubec, not less than two each, and the compensation of the 53 wardens shall be two dollars per day and expenses when 54 actually employed. No person shall be eligible for appoint-55 ment as warden who is the owner in a sardine factory or a 56 relative of such an owner in the town where such factory is 57 located.'

'Sect. 5. All acts or parts of acts, inconsistent with this act, 59 are hereby repealed.'
