STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of building for the Maine Industrial School.
for Girls.

Resolved, That there be and is hereby appropriated from the
2 funds of the state treasury the sum of five thousand dollars for
3 a building at the Industrial School for Girls. This appropria-
4 tion is made on the express condition that the trustees of the
5 Maine Industrial School for Girls at Hallowell convey to the
6 state of Maine all the property, rights, privileges and interests
7 held and controlled by the said corporation, provided that said
8 appropriation of five thousand dollars shall not be expended till
9 the plans and bills for such expenditure shall have been ap-
10 proved by the governor and council.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

On the 2nd inst., the roof was burned from one of the buildings and the third story wrecked. In this third story was lodged sixteen girls and a teacher. In view of the damage to life from fire in such a building the trustees earnestly desire to remove this third story and make a two-story structure, adding a wing which shall have the same sleeping room capacity on the second floor, with room on the first floor for the laundry and bath rooms, now located in the cellar. The cost of such a wing with heating apparatus, plumbing and furniture, all complete, is estimated at \$4,500 in addition to the amount which we are to receive for insurance after fully repairing the main building. The new two-story building is fully provided with fire escapes ; neither of the others are thus protected. The trustees ask for an additional appropriation of \$500 for this purpose, making in all \$5,000.
