IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-NINE.

AN ACT to amend "An Act to incorporate the City of Gardiner."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section two of chapter two hundred and ninety2 six of the Private and Special Laws of 1883, is hereby
3 amended by striking out all of said section after the words
4 "at large" in the fifth line and adding the following:

'City marshal and street commissioner, and it shall take a 6 plurality of all ballots cast in said city to elect said alderman 7 at large, city marshal and street commissioner, and the duties 8 of said alderman at large shall be the same as those of the 9 other members of the board of aldermen, and the duties of

10 the city marshal and street commissioner shall be the same as
11 now prescribed by law,' so that said section as amended shall
12 read as follows:

'Sect. 2. At the annual election for the choice of mayor 14 and other officers, after the abolition of the common coun15 cil, should said body be abolished, the qualified electors in 16 each ward shall, in addition to voting for their ward officers 17 and mayor, vote for an alderman at large, city marshal and 18 street commissioner, and it shall take a plurality of all bal19 lots cast in said city to elect said alderman at large, city mar20 shal and street commissioner, and the duties of said alderman 21 at large shall be the same as those of the other members of 22 the board of aldermen, and the duties of the city marshal and 23 street commissioner shall be the same as those now prescribed 24 by law.'

- Sect. 2. After the adoption of this act, all acts and por-2 tions of acts of said city charter, inconsistent with this act, 3 are hereby repealed.
 - Sect. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
