### STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-NINE.

AN ACT to amend the Laws of 1893, Chapter 304, as amended by Laws of 1895, Chapter 40, relating to Boards of Registration.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section four of chapter 304, is hereby amended

- 2 by inserting after the word "State" in the second line, the
- 3 words 'having four thousand or more inhabitants' and by
- 4 adding to said section the following words, 'In all cities hav-
- 5 ing less than four thousand inhabitants, the municipal offi-
- 6 cers shall make such a list, exercising the same powers and

7 being governed by the same laws as municipal officers of 8 towns having five hundred or more registered voters,' so that 9 said section as amended, shall read as follows:

'Sect. 4. A board of registration is hereby established in each city of the State having four thousand or more inhabilizants, which shall have exclusive power and authority to determine the qualification of voters therein, and exclusive power to make up, correct and revise the list of voters in each of said cities, and shall perform all the duties, and have exclusive sively, all the powers now exercised by boards of registration or by the municipal officers of said cities in making, preparing ing, revising and correcting the list of voters therein, under chapter four of the Revised Statutes, or any other statutes relating thereto. In all cities having less than four thousand inhabitants, the municipal officers shall make such list, exercising the same powers and being governed by the same laws as municipal officers of towns having five hundred or more registered voters.'
