STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the Town of Trescott.

Resolved, That the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars be
2 and hereby is appropriated annually for the years eighteen
3 hundred and ninety-nine and nineteen hundred, to aid the
4 town of Trescott to maintain roads and bridges in said town
5 and that the money be expended under the direction of the
6 county commissioners.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Trescott was incorporated in 1827, formerly plantation No. nine. Has a population of 485. Polls, 114. Valuation, about \$57,000. This session of legislature has set off a portion of this town on to the town of Edmunds, leaving about \$50,000 valuation, on a more than cash value. It has about thirty-eight miles of roads left and numerous bridges to keep in repair. The town is poor and heavily in debt; the rate of taxation is about 4.07 per cent. The present condition of the roads and bridges are such as to require a large expenditure to keep them in safe condition. The town is without manufactures of any kind, purely a farming section on poor soil.
