### STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY NINE.

AN ACT in relation to Foreign Banking Associations and Corporations.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Every banking association or corporation, not

- 2 incorporated under the laws of this State or of the United
- 3 States, that maintains a branch or agency in this State for the
- 4 transaction of a banking business, shall pay to the State
- 5 treasurer a tax of one-fourth of one per cent per annum on
- 6 the amount of such business done in this State. One-half
- 7 of said tax shall be paid on the amount of such business for
- 8 the six months ending on the last Saturday of April, and the
- 9 other half on the amount for the six months ending the last

Saturday of October, or for such portion of such periods as said association or corporation may transact business in this State. The amount of such business done in this State shall be ascertained by first computing the daily average for each month of the period of all the moneys outstanding upon loans and investments and of all other moneys received, used or employed in connection with such business, and by then dividing the aggregate of such monthly averages by the number of months covered by said return; and the quotient resulting shall be deemed the amount of such business. The amount of such tax so ascertained shall be paid to the State treasurer semi-annually within ten days after the first Mondays in June and December.

Sect. 2. It shall be the duty of such association or corpo2 ration and of the manager or agent of such branch or agency
3 to cause a written report to be made to the bank examiner
4 on or before the last Saturdays of May and November of
5 each year, verified by the oath of such manager or agent,
6 giving the amount of such business transacted in this State
7 under the rule given in section one, and stating the amount
8 of State tax which such branch or agency is liable to pay,
9 and setting forth in detail the daily average for each month
10 preceding the last Saturday of April and October; and also
11 giving such further or additional information as to the busi12 ness of such foreign banking association or corporation done
13 in this State as may be required by the bank examiner.

Sect. 3. Every such banking association or corporation 2 and its managers, agents and employes, shall cause to be kept 3 at all times in the office where such business is transacted in

4 this State, a full and accurate account of the moneys used or 5 employed in such business and of the deposits therein, and 6 such account, together with the books, papers and records 7 relating to the business done in this State, shall be subject 8 to the inspection and examination of the bank examiner, or 9 of any clerk designated by him, during business hours of any 10 day on which business may legally be transacted.

Sect. 4. Except as hereinbefore provided, no banking as2 sociation, unless incorporated under the laws of this State
3 or of the United States, shall maintain any branch or agency
4 in this State for the transaction of banking business. Any
5 officer, agent or employe of such association or corporation
6 doing business in this State contrary to the provisions of this
7 act, shall be subject to a penalty of not less than one hundred
8 nor more than five hundred dollars for each offense, to be
9 recovered by indictment to the use of the State.

Sect. 5. This act shall take effect September 1st, 1899.
