STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-NINE.

AN ACT to amend section 8, chapter 24 of the Revised Statutes as amended by chapter 326 of the laws of 1897 relating to Soldiers.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section eight of chapter 24 of the Revised Statutes, as 2 amended by chapter 326 of the Public Laws of 1897, is 3 hereby amended by inserting after the word "sixty-one" in 4 the third line of said section as amended, the following 5 words: 'or in the war of eighteen hundred and ninety-6 eight;' so that said section when amended shall read as 7 follows:

'Sect. 8. No soldier or sailor who served by enlistment in 9 the army or navy of the United States, in the war of eighteen

10 hundred and sixty-one, or in the war of eighteen hundred 11 and ninety-eight, and who has received an honorable dis-12 charge from said service, and who has or may become 13 dependent upon any town, shall be considered a pauper, or 14 be subject to disfranchisement for that cause; but the time 15 during which said soldier or sailor is so dependent, shall not 16 be included in the period of residence necessary to change 17 his settlement; and overseers of the poor shall not have 18 authority to remove to, or support in, the poor house, any 19 such dependent soldier or sailor or his family; the word 20 "family" here used shall be held to include the soldier or 21 sailor, his wife, his unmarried minor children living with 22 him and dependent upon him for support, and such other 23 unmarried children of his dependent upon him for support, 24 who by reason of mental incapacity or physical disability 25 are unable to provide for themselves; but the town of his 26 settlement shall support them at his own home in the town 27 of his settlement or residence, or in such suitable place other 28 than the poor house, as the overseers of the town of his settle-29 ment may deem right and proper. In case of a violation of 30 this act the overseers of the poor shall be subject to a fine 31 of twenty-five dollars. And for every day they allow them 32 to remain in such poor house, after reasonable notice, they 33 shall be subject to a further fine of five dollars per day, to 34 be recovered by complaint or indictment. This section shall 35 not be so construed as to deprive overseers of the poor of 36 any right to remove and support such dependent soldier or 37 sailor and his family in the town of his settlement as herein 38 provided.'
